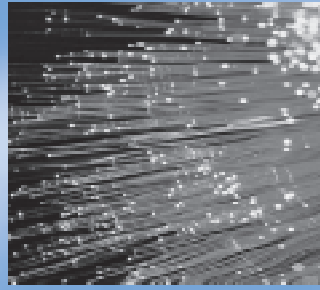

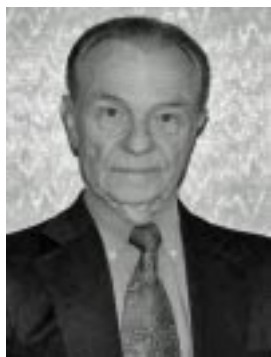

Appointment of a New President

On behalf of the Barclay College Board of Trustees, Marjorie Thompson, Board Chair would like to introduce



Mr. Herb Frazier as the new president of Barclay College. For over five decades, Mr. Frazier has been affiliated with Barclay College in many various aspects and endeavors. It was from this list of achievements and his devotion to Barclay that the Board of Trustees chose to offer the presidential appointment to Herb last June. Because of his complete

faithfulness and loyalty to Barclay, Mr. Frazier graciously accepted the challenge of becoming Barclay College's 17th president.

Over the years Mr. Frazier has served in development and alumni relations at Barclay, pioneered joint degree programs, and assisted in guiding the college through many of its accreditation reviews. Perhaps more importantly, Herb Frazier has the heart of a servant. No one is more persevering; no one is more tenacious. No one is more positive, and no one has more faith to believe and achieve. Herb's commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ is seen through his commitment to his family, his church, and his community. He and his wife Shirley are dedicated to serving God, to this college and its success, and to each member of the Barclay College student body, faculty and staff, the alumni and the entire Barclay College Association.

Mr. Frazier earned a bachelor's degree at Emporia State University and a master's degree in School Administration from the University of Kansas as well as completing several graduate hours at the University of Alabama. He served as the Academic Dean for Friends Bible College from 1967 to 1975. He returned to the college in 1978 and served until 1984 as the Director of Admissions. Most recently, Mr. Frazier has served as the Alumni Coordinator.

On behalf of the Barclay College Board of Trustees, it is with a very grateful heart to the Lord for His provision for this institution at this place and time, that we introduce to you the President of Barclay College, Mr. Herb Frazier.

The Institute for Pastoral Leadership Development

He had a dream. David Robinson, Barclay graduate and current Superintendent for the Evangelical Friends Church – Mid-America Yearly Meeting (EFC-MAYM), saw a great need among pastors and prospective

pastors for adequate training and godly mentoring in order to provide the kind of reliable and effective leadership that is needed for local churches to fulfill the Great Commission. As a former pastor and seminary president, David knew firsthand the value of higher education, but he also knew that there were many ministers of the gospel who, for a variety of reasons, were not able to attend college or seminary. In addition, those church leaders who had completed a formal education were in continual need of personal growth and professional development. After many years of prayer and exploration, this dream recently became a reality through the creation of the Institute for Pastoral Leadership Development.

Under the direction of fellow EFC-MAYM staff member David Kingrey, the Institute for Pastoral Leadership Development held its first session on February 7, 2005 at University Friends Church in Wichita, Kansas. Hoping to have at least 8 to 12 people in attendance for this first class, EFC-MAYM leaders were overwhelmed when 64 enthusiastic pastors, youth workers, worship leaders, church planters, students and spouses showed up instead! Coming from 4 states and driving up to 4 hours to get there, this diverse group of church leaders included many students from Barclay College as well.

Meeting once a month for three hours, the Institute plans to offer a total of 12 courses over a 3-year period, leading to a Certificate of Excellence in Church Leadership. Participants are asked to pay a minimal fee of \$10 per session, or \$30 per course. The first course, "Preaching, Teaching and Worship," was led by David Williams, Professor of Pastoral Ministries and Chaplain at Barclay College. Glenn Leppert, Barclay's Vice President for Academic Services and Registrar, taught the third course on "Theology and Church History." Both professors were well-received by the class participants, and Professor Williams has been invited to return for the New Testament Survey course which will begin in February, 2006.

At least 137 ministers have now participated in the Institute for Pastoral Leadership Development. Considering the fact that more than 50 high school and college students from EFC-MAYM have recently sensed a call to some form of full-time Christian service, it seems clear that God has raised up the Institute "for such a time as this" (Esther 4:14). Based on our historical partnership with EFC-MAYM, Barclay is uniquely positioned to serve as a resource for both participation and instruction within the Institute, and we look forward to working together even more closely in the days ahead for the sake of Christ and His Kingdom.

President's Perspective

I never aspired to be the president of Barclay College. My first experience with Barclay College (Friends Bible College) was when I arrived on campus from Houston in 1943 to enroll as a fourteen-year-old academy sophomore. My father and mother were Friends ministers, and I will be forever grateful for their sacrifice to give me a Christian foundation. When I graduated from the academy in 1946, I did not return to the campus for 20 years. During those years, I was often influenced by my memory of the godly people at Barclay and the respect I had for them.

After I retired from teaching mathematics at Haviland High School, my wife, Shirley, and I worked for five years at the Mid-America Yearly Meeting office in Wichita. In 2001, one of my grandsons in California told me he was coming to Barclay College. I was surprised and thrilled. Shirley and I immediately resigned our positions with the Yearly Meeting and moved back to our home in Haviland so our grandson could live with us while he attended college.

In God's providence, Maurice Chandler (president of Barclay College at that time) hired me to work in development and alumni relations. I had dreamed for years of planning alumni events for the college. The past four years, Shirley and I have held six alumni dinners at different locations across the country and have planned three block reunions for alumni weekend. Each of these activities has been unusually well attended and has been most rewarding. The last four years have been the happiest of my life.

Be assured that with God's help I will work to make Barclay College a school of which you can be proud and that will meet the needs of students who will minister throughout the world. Pray for Barclay College and for me so that "The Miracle on the Prairie" can continue to be a miracle.

Finally, I am probably the oldest president in the history of the college. If that concerns you, I want to share with you the following scripture: "The righteous will flourish like a palm tree... they will bear fruit in old age, they will stay fresh and green..." Psalms 92:12-14, NIV

Board Business

He attended his senior year of high school at Haviland Friends Academy and graduated from Friends Bible College in May of 1946. He earned his Doctor of Philosophy Degree at the University of Iowa. Following his term with the university, Duane secured funds for the National Benevolence Association of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in St. Louis.

Following his retirement, Duane traveled 5,000 miles and raised \$55,000 for Barclay College as a memorial for Dr. Charles S. Ball, the president he admired while he attended Friends Bible College.

The Barclay College Alumni Association honored Duane as the College's Alumnus of the Year in May of 2004. Duane's close association with the College in recent years and the work he has done to help it succeed will be greatly missed. A memorial for Duane has been established at Barclay College in his memory.

Enrollment Report

The enrollment figures for the Fall 2005 reporting period were lower than in the past several years. The headcount for the on-campus program came to 90 with the FTE at 84. Last fall, the headcount for the campus program was 114. Overall, the FTE for the total college program is 104. Offsetting the low enrollment figure is the fact that the students on campus are committed to learning and feel a definite call from the Lord. A spirit of revival is very present. Of the students on campus, 54 (60%) are from the Friends Church. Twenty-five denominations are represented on campus, with 60% from the Friends church. Encourage the youth in your life to attend Barclay College. Our preview weekend, Breakaway, is March 30 through April 1, 2006.

Summer Ministry

This summer, the band called Aria, had the opportunity to travel across the western half of the United States leading worship at different camps and youth group events while recruiting for Barclay College. The band consisted of Kris Smitherman on bass guitar, Jared Haley on electric guitar and vocals, Andrew Happle on drums for the first half of the trip, Nathaniel Carlson on drums for the second half, Megan Frazier on vocals, and David Frazier on acoustic guitar and vocals.



The vision came in the fall of 2004 to change the school's summer ministry from camp counselors, to being the worship leaders at the camps. This opened a lot of possibilities for recruitment, and the Lord seemed to bless it in a big way. We were required to raise support for the ministry and we only had one month in which to accomplish this goal. We knew that the Lord would perfectly cover our expenses, but God is so big and gracious, He met our proposed budget...and more! We were all compensated for our work over the summer in the end. God is so good!

Our travels led us almost 7,000 miles through 5 different State Capitols, and across 12 state lines. We had the opportunity to lead worship for 6 camps with 5 of them being Friends Youth camps. We were blessed to be able to be exposed to youth in Mid-America Yearly Meeting, Rocky Mountain Yearly Meeting, Northwest Yearly Meeting, and Southwest Yearly Meeting. It was great fun getting to make connections in all these different areas and to see how the Lord is working in each.

The Holy Spirit led the recruiting that we did. Many students became interested in Barclay College this summer, and there are several students at school this semester that we made contact with during the summer ministry. The Lord used some of those conversations to clarify a calling on their lives to ministry or to attend Barclay. It is such a humbling thought that the Lord would use us to deliver His calling to people.

We had an excellent summer, and we're looking forward to doing it again next summer. We are in the early stages of planning and would hugely appreciate your prayers and encouragement. We will see where the Lord will take this ministry next. We are so thankful to be a part of the ministry at Barclay College.

President's Cabinet Transition

In making the transition from one administration to another at Barclay College, a new presidential cabinet has been formed. Dr. Glenn Leppert has been named Vice President for Academic Services and continues to carry out the responsibilities of Registrar as well as teaching Greek.
