## SPRING STATISTICS

The first question asked every semester, usually well before registration day is over, is "What is the FTE (full-time equivalency) for the semester?" Most years, because of students completing programs in December, not returning for the spring semester, or changing status from full-time to part-time, the spring FTE is lower than it was in the fall. Since 1981, three times including this spring (S93, S98, and S06), rather than going lower, the FTE stayed the same for the on-campus program. While it looked as if the FTE might actually be one point higher, in the end it remained the same. The FTE for the Fall 2005 semester was 84, calculated with 80 full-time students and 10 part-time students having enough hours to represent 4 full-time students. Twelve new students were added for the Spring 2006 semester offsetting those who left. Altogether there are 78 full-time students and 10 part-time students with enough hours between them to equate to 6 full-time students making the total FTE 84 as in the fall. For the total college program, including degree completion students and students doing Home College classes, the total headcount for this spring is 94 and the total FTE is 86. An unduplicated headcount for the year is 148.

## 2005 CHRISTMAS WREATH SETS NEW RECORD

Thanks to the faithful support of so many of you, the Christmas Wreath, as of the end of January, totaled \$105,459.30. This amount represents an all-time high. Not only was the matching gift of \$35,000 met, it was tripled. Praise God!

Donations were received from 266 homes, churches, and businesses and came from 22 different states.

## JOB OPENINGS AVAILABLE

The College is seeking to fill three positions: The major professor for the Christian School Elementary Education position, a general education position that will combine English with either math and science or education classes, and the position of Director of Library Services.

Needed for the Elementary Education position is a person with Friends connections who has both an educational training and classroom experience, particularly as an elementary school teacher. This person, it is hoped, will not only build up the student population in this major but also help the college move the major on to state certification in addition to maintaining the ACSI affiliation that now exists.

With the retirement of Sylvia Morley this coming June there is need for a person to teach English and other general education subjects. Sylvia Morley has filled a full-time role teaching English and education classes since 1996. While there is need for English classes each semester, her replacement will also need to either cover education classes, or ideally, math or science, or perhaps a Bible and ministry combination with the English classes. According to the Vice President of Academics, Dr. Glenn Leppert, it would be wonderful if the college could combine the Elementary Education positions and English by finding an individual who could be the major professor for the elementary education major and at the same time cover the English classes.

Jeanette Parker has worked in the library since she graduated from the college in 1999. She received her M.L.S. and has filled the position of Director of Library Services since 2001. She plans to move closer to family and to try another area, that of public librarian. She will be greatly missed as she has completed several major projects in the library and has advanced the library's collection of electronic media.

The head of the major for Youth Ministry has been vacant this last year. This position is now filled. It has been offered to Dr. Skip Payette who will be returning after a year's absence in which he served as Vice President for Academics and Registrar for a seminary in Oakland, California.

## BARCLAY PROFESSOR PUBLISHES BOOKS

After twenty-five years as a full-time faculty member and a few years after retiring, Dr. Fred R. Johnson published *Toward Conformity to the Image of Christ*. He wrote the books while teaching a course entitled *Doctrine of Holiness* and currently uses them as primary texts. The goal of the books is to offer a biblical pattern for becoming Christ-like in thought, word, and deed. This work shows that both the Holy Spirit and the believer participate in the quest of becoming conformed to the image of Christ.

The greatest challenge for Christians is to live according to the way Jesus lived. The current name for this pursuit is spiritual formation. Volume One, published 2004, is subtitled *A Biblical Pattern of Spiritual Formation* and the subtitle of Volume Two, 2005, is *A Biblical Product of Spiritual Formation*.

## STUDENTS AID IN HURRICANE RELIEF EFFORT

Through Friends Disaster Service, seven Barclay College students were able to minister to Hurricane victims along the gulf coast. Pictured left to right (bottom of page, on right), Rob Willoughby, Jenny Holton, Zak Caldwell, Tara Healy, Stephanie Hollingshead, Josh Walworth, and Jewell Collins arrived in Johnson's Bayou, Louisiana on Thursday, January 26 and worked throughout the weekend. This community has received very little government assistance and many families are still living in flood-damaged homes with no heat or electricity.

Tara Healy said of her experience, "To visually see the need of the people of the area on television is one thing but to have a close encounter with the reality of the destruction is something words can hardly describe. Yet in the midst of the destruction hope is blossoming. It was a reminder that ministry is not always done through amazing preaching, teaching or proper hermeneutics but by the sweat of the brow and a willing heart. The Lord used the labor of the work team to bless an elderly gentleman who, quite literally, lost everything in the storm. It was an amazing experience we participated in and I know we all saw the Lord's hand at work."

### *The following is a letter sent to the college from Friends Disaster Service Texas-area coordinator, Tom Hoke:*

I want to thank you for the great team of young adults you allowed to come and help at Johnson Bayou, Louisiana. They were God-sent. They reflected humbleness and a willingness to serve wherever needed. They conducted themselves in a way that should make Barclay proud.

Thank you for financing their trip, it helped FDS to free our funds for use for the victims of Hurricane Rita. Our focus is to help the elderly, disabled and the disadvantaged. The people we help basically have no other way to help themselves. Most have little available monies to fund their own repairs. With the help you sent, we were able to completely prepare the inside of the home of Raymond Badon for needed repairs. In addition, the roof was readied for new shingles. As we left Mr. Badon, with tears in his eyes, he was truly amazed at how much was accomplished in three days. Without your group, it would not have been possible.

## SPIRITUAL EMPHASIS WEEK

The theme for this year's Spiritual Life Emphasis Week is, "Life Together: Dynamics of an Authentic Christian Community," based on Acts 2:42 (below). Throughout the April 10-13, we will be asking the Father to help us turn our eyes more fully upon Jesus as we prepare for Easter, paying special attention to the ways in which the risen Christ reveals himself to us in the midst of our corporate life together as a community of faith.

The theme for the week is inspired by the title of a classic on Christian community written more than 50 years ago by Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a Lutheran pastor who sought to remain faithful to Christ in the midst of Nazi Germany. Bonhoeffer understood the value of Christian fellowship, as illustrated in this excerpt from *Life Together*: "It is easily forgotten that the fellowship of Christian brethren is a gift of grace, a gift of the Kingdom of God that any day may be taken from us ... therefore, let him who until now has had the privilege of living a common Christian life with other Christians praise God's grace from the bottom of his heart. Let him thank God on his knees and declare: It is grace, nothing but grace, that we are allowed to live in community with Christian brethren."

These special Holy Week services will be held Monday-Thursday at Haviland Friends Church. Morning sessions, at 10:50 a.m., will introduce the focus for the day, emphasizing the importance of Scripture, fellowship, worship and prayer in the formation of Christian community. Evening sessions will provide practical opportunities to implement these principles through participation in small groups and various spiritual exercises, including a special Maundy Thursday communion service.
