

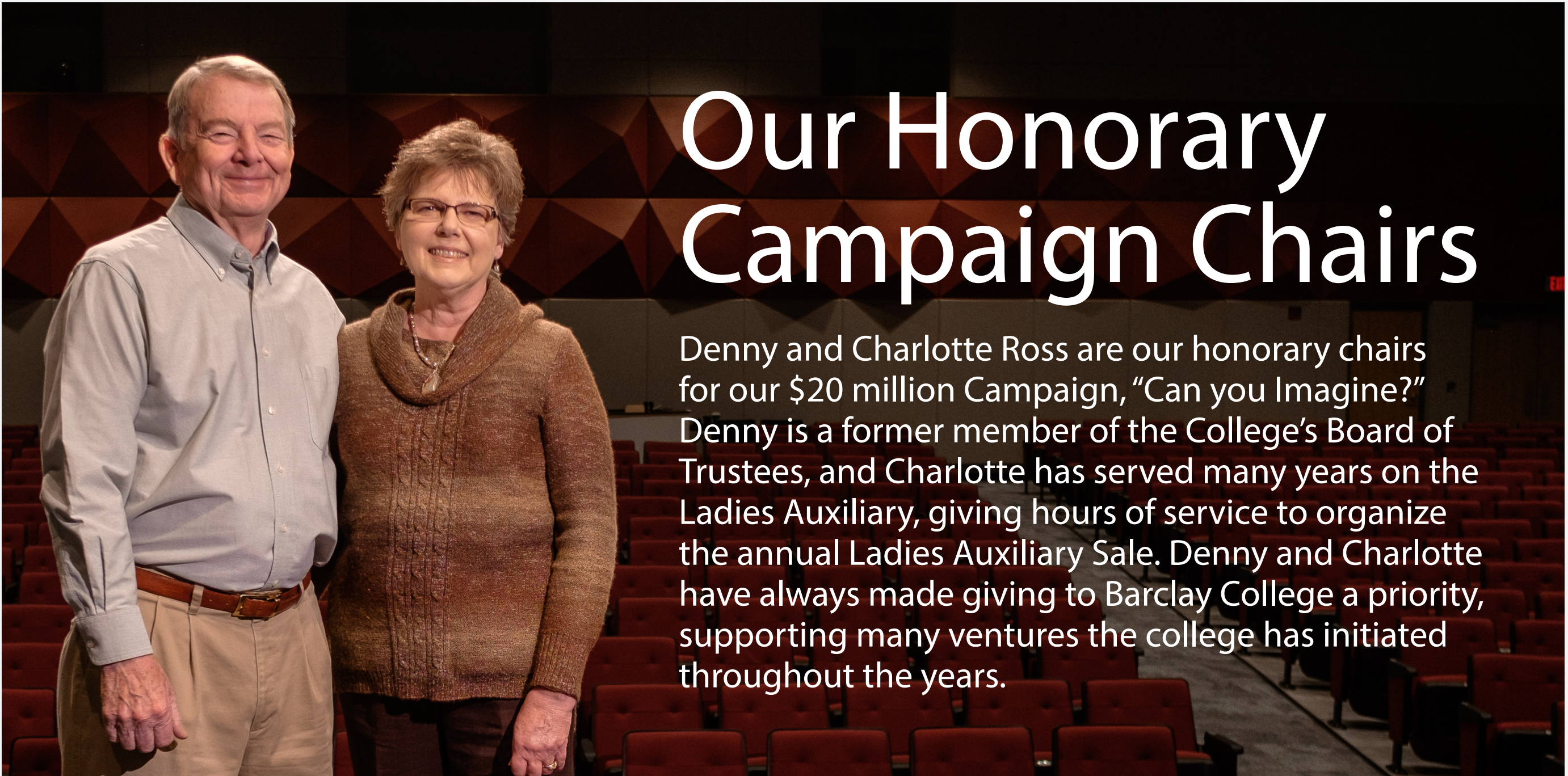

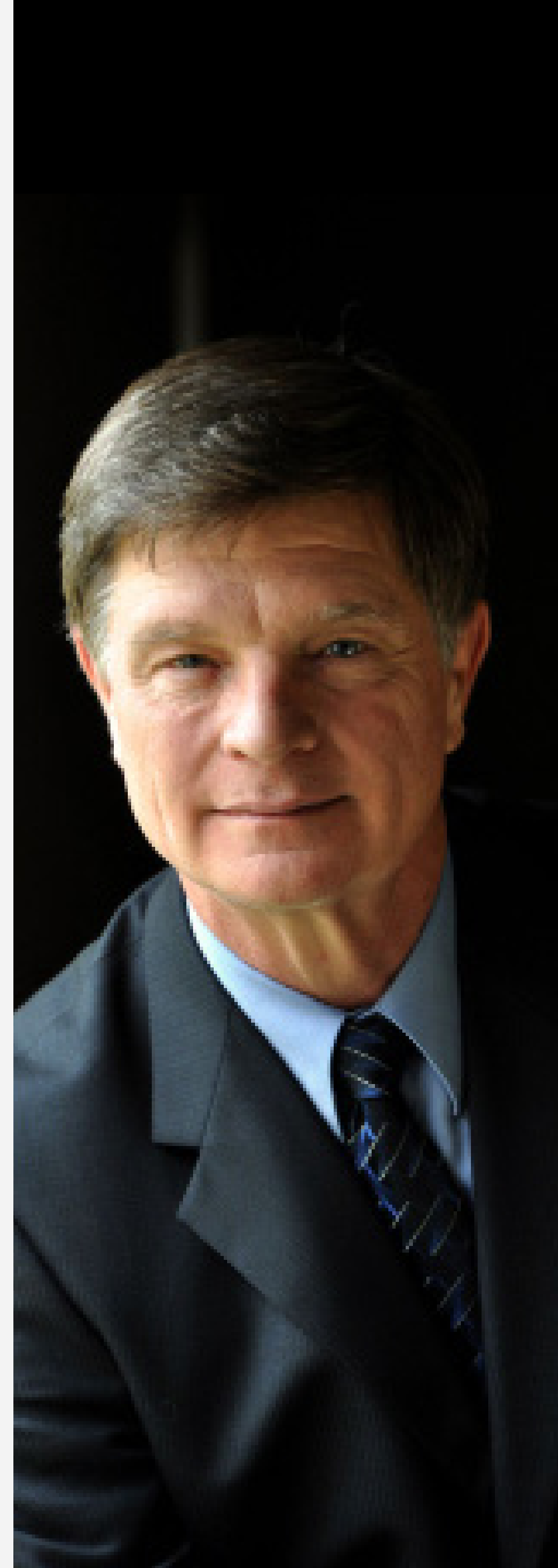
In 2006 the board reaffirmed the Identity Statement of the college:

# How does an endowment work?

An endowment invests assets in a permanent, self-sustaining source of funding designated for a specific purpose within the college. Each year, a portion of the interest accrued by the fund is paid out to support the fund's purpose, and any earnings in excess of this distribution are used to build the fund's market value. In this way, an endowment fund grows and provides support for its designated purpose in perpetuity. When you establish an endowment fund, you create a permanent legacy of support for Barclay College.

An endowment is often funded as a legacy gift from an estate plan that commits funds for academic purposes or for facilities. Academic purposes such as a Barclay degree department, Centers for Excellence, or even a concentration within a department can be funded, as well as new facilities or renovation of existing facilities. On the next pages you will see a variety of opportunities and the minimum funding levels required.

An endowment agreement establishes how funds will be distributed. Barclay has a standard Endowment Investment Policy, and we work with you to honor your preferences. Barclay College's endowment assets are managed by a professionally-staffed investment organization. The funds are controlled by the Endowment Committee established by Barclay College Board of Trustees.

Barclay recognizes individuals whose cumulative gifts and pledges to all areas of Barclay College total \$100,000 or more. Members of the Barclay College Legacy Society are invited to campus once a year for a special celebration to recognize their generosity.

*The timeline shows how an endowment grows from an initial gift of \$20,000,000 over a period of 50 years. Anticipating an annual earnings of 8.0%, the college receives 5% of the interest to use toward the fund's purpose, and the remaining 3% is reinvested in the principal amount to build the endowment over 50 years and beyond.*

# Endowments for Academic Programs

Barclay College encourages endowments to our academic departments, academic chairs or Centers for Excellence at a funding level of \$1,000,000. A minimum \$500,000 endowment can be funded for concentrations or chairs within departments. Administrative oversight of the college such as the president, vice presidents, or chancellor can also be endowed for a minimum \$500,000. An Endowed Full Tuition Scholar Award of \$50,000 can honor an annual distinguished undergraduate student.

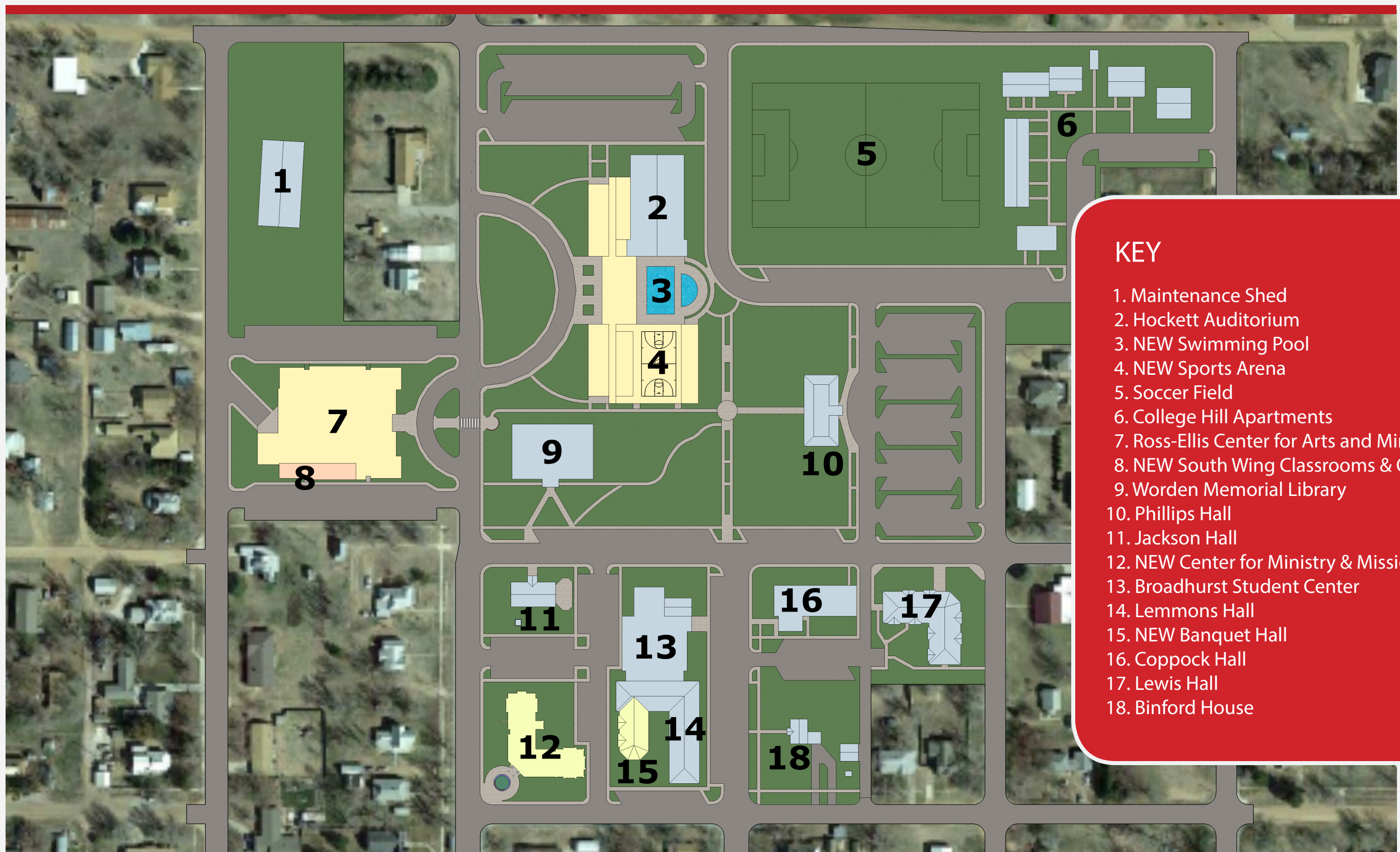
## Centers for Excellence

# How to Give

Barclay College welcomes endowments that fund entire projects, or donations that contribute to established endowments. Endowments are often established through an estate plan which commits the funds as a legacy gift in years to come.

Once you establish an endowment, you embark on a new relationship with Barclay College. You will be updated regularly as to the difference your gift is making. Often, donors or their families continue to make gifts to their established endowment funds over time.

The Endowment Agreement will determine how the funds will be managed and distributed. We will work with you to honor your preferences. Once an endowment reaches the minimum funding level and starts generating spendable income, Barclay College will begin sending you annual reports detailing the value and use of your endowment fund. Our Endowment Investment Policy is available upon request.

You can make a future gift of any size to an existing endowment fund without signing an endowment agreement. There may be an existing endowment that reflects your interests and to which you can add your support. Funding must reach a predetermined minimum level before it can generate spendable income.

## In a nutshell, an endowed gift:

- Gives the College flexibility and freedom to embark on new disciplines and to offer prestige and recognition to benefactors and beneficiaries
- Ensures regular funding levels for College departments, programs, and operations
- Helps stem rises in tuition/costs by providing needed financial aid
- Provides donors with an opportunity to create a legacy or honor a loved one and support the people and programs at Barclay College in perpetuity
